

## I Need to Be Safe

Children are aware of domestic violence that happens in their home, whether or not they directly see the abuse occurring.

Witnessing domestic violence traumatizes a child each time it occurs.

Children are impacted when they:

- see and hear violence occurring
- experience the aftermath of abuse such as damage to the home, injuries, or parental depression
- are threatened as part of the abuse
- become confidents or provide care of their parent(s)
- have their family break apart
- are victims of child abuse

Some of the impacts of witnessing domestic abuse depend on the age of the child. Regardless, the impact may be mitigated by supports in the child's life as well as the child's level of resilience.
