Community Living – Vocational Services

Vocational Services are offered through:

- *Activity Centres* are facilities designed for individuals who have limited motor and sensory development. Programming emphasizes basic living skills, socialization and recreation. Although some activities may be of a productive nature, they are secondary to the primary goal of maximizing an individual's potential in the community setting.
- *Sheltered workshops* focus on training and production. Clients develop work and social skills until they are able either to reach their potential level of independence or obtain competitive employment. A portion of the profit realized by workshops is returned to clients.
- **Day Activity Programs** provide activities that range from full-time, centre-based activities to integration of seniors into existing programs.
- **Long-term Employment Program** ensures ongoing employment for persons with disabilities by providing support services such as job coaching or wage subsidy initiatives.

Saskatchewan Association for Community Living (SACL)

The SACL has long believed that people with intellectual disabilities can and want to be valued employees in real, paid jobs. Employment Opportunities makes the goal of a real job possible for people with intellectual disabilities. The EO program is designed to support people with intellectual disabilities as they look for jobs, move to a new career or look ahead to leaving high school. It also offers support to employers who have job opportunities.

The program is funded through the government's Ministry of Advanced Education, Employment and Labour. Employment Consultants use a fund called Employability Assistance for People with Disabilities (EAPD) to bring together prospective employers and people with disabilities who are looking for work. Employment Consultants also work with high school educators, students and families to support the transition of students with intellectual disabilities from high school into the world of work, further education and adult life experiences. Job experience while students are still in school is essential. SACL partners with the Department of Culture, Youth and Recreation to develop supported employment experience opportunities for students while they are still in school.

Systemic improvements are necessary to create change. The SACL has worked with the government to develop a variety of post-secondary training programs through community colleges and SIAST campuses so that opportunities to gain better employment skills exist for people with disabilities. Currently, options in training and employment are very limited and SACL wants to change the status quo.

The Homelessness Partnering Strategy

The Homelessness Partnering Strategy (HPS) was announced by the federal government on December 19, 2006. The HPS replaces the National Homelessness Initiative, which expired on March 31, 2007. The Strategy, which began on April 1, 2007, provides \$269.6 million over two years to prevent and reduce homelessness by helping to establish the structures and supports needed to move homeless and at-risk individuals towards self sufficiency and full participation in Canadian society. This strategy builds and improves upon the National Homelessness Initiative by focusing on a “housing-first” approach to homelessness in Canada. By working with communities, provinces and territories, partners in the private and not-for-profit sectors and Aboriginal partners, the Strategy encourages an effective alignment of federal/provincial/territorial investments and helps homeless individuals and families to access the range of services and programs that they need to move towards self-sufficiency.

Under the HPS, the federal government will offer the provinces and territories the opportunity to enter into bilateral partnerships, improve collaboration and develop linkages between the federal homelessness programs and provincial/territorial social services to help communities make strategic investments that will best serve their homeless populations.

SHELTERS FOR WOMEN AND YOUTH

Provincial Association of Transition Houses and Services of Saskatchewan (PATHS)

PATHS is a non-profit organization formed in 1984. Membership is comprised of Transition and Interval Houses, Temporary Emergency Shelters, and Second Stage Housing that provides services to abused women and their children. Shelters and outreach services provide temporary housing, food, and support for women fleeing violence, and their children. A shelter stay is generally free of charge. How long individuals can stay varies from shelter to shelter, but typically the maximum stay is set between 4 and 6 weeks. While staying at the shelter, the staff can assist in planning for the future by offering safety, a supportive ear, abuse information, support along with referrals to counselling, financial services, legal support and housing.

Those shelters designated as “2nd Stage” are designed for women and their children who are looking for secure, affordable housing on a longer-term basis. Generally, women in 2nd stage housing have been residents at an emergency/1st stage/temporary shelter before securing 2nd stage accommodation. Outreach programs can provide emergency shelter and transportation to shelters in larger centers. They also provide ongoing counselling services.
